# Innovative Equipment Repurposing Saves City of Coolidge over \$150,000

The Coolidge Fire Department's out-of-service 1996 International 4900 Ferrara Fire Apparatus found new purpose thanks to a creative solution from the City's Fleet Maintenance foreman.

Outdated by National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards, the truck was considered for auction but its low mileage and excellent condition prompted the Coolidge's City Council to recommend finding alternative uses for the vehicle. After evaluating the frame, engine, and hydraulic systems, the Fleet Maintenance team proposed retrofitting the truck frame to create a 5-yard dump truck for the Solid Waste Division which could be used to replace the 1991 Ford F800 model that was in use and far overdue for retirement.

Partnering with local custom equipment builder, Drake Equipment, the City was able to convert the Ferrara Fire Aparatus vehicle into a new dump truck at a cost of \$25,794—well within their \$30,000 budget. How was this possible? Utilizing the existing hydraulic system lowered costs, and the truck's original fire apparatus bed will be auctioned to further offset expenses. With a new dump truck typically costing around \$180,000, this innovative repurposing saved the City over \$150,000 while significantly upgrading essential equipment that was low on the priority list

due to the cost of replacement.

The City Council commended the project for its cost-effective, sustainable approach to meeting operational needs. Innovations such as this demonstrate the value of collaborative problemsolving within local agencies.

#### **STAY PREPARED FOR WINTER** WEATHER DURING THIS HOLIDAY **SEASON**

The snowy season is upon us here in Arizona and as always, AZ LTAP would like to remind you all to be as prepared as possible while on the road. Below are some standard general practices that should give you and your loved ones peace of mind when you venture out this winter:

- Plan your travel route in advance.
- Notify someone of your route, destination and projected arrival time.
- Fill your fuel tank and try to keep it at three-quarters full. Running out of gas is extremely dangerous during winter conditions.
- Visit Arizona Traveler Information, download the AZ 511 app or dial 511 for updated road and weather conditions.

For even more ways to prepare, visit the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's website.

#### WINTER TRAINING REMINDER

In addition to sharing some preparedness tips, AZ LTAP would like to remind agencies requesting training in areas anticipated to receive snowfall that while we still offer trainings on-demand, hazardous winter conditions for our trainers and your employees may result in postponement of in-person training.

#### **NEW!** Winter Road Maintenance & Operations Course Launching in 2025

Finally, we are happy to be in the final stages of piloting our Winter Road Maintenance & Operations course. This course covers topics operations staff will need to prepare for the upcoming winter season. Topics include pre-season preparation, snow removal, use of deicers, equipment calibration, equipment inspection, pre/post trip equipment inspection, safety and other best practices. Starting January 2025, this couse will be available to all agencies to request for delivery.
